The work of Pedro Valdez Cardoso is based on moving closer to the other, in order to question oneself. In this process, investigating the idea of culture and distance, we seek a space of confluence and miscegenation where, more than affirming things, we pose questions.

The sculptures that the author builds assume a hybrid nature, in which the juxtaposition of ancestral and tribal references (e.g. the mask or totem) intersects with urban references from the present day (e.g. graffiti and decorative arts).

In a deliberate process of juxtaposition - blending popular and erudite culture, street culture and the museum, remote and contemporary culture - his work explores the nature of something that reinvents itself in time and space, in terms of its mode and medium, and that, by way of acculturation, discovers new operating logics. Thus, by bringing together shapes, materials, periods and different uses, Pedro Valdez Cardoso creates something that questions distance, and also difference.

The question of (dis)encounter thus underlies the questioning framed by these works, manifested in the roots of the topics addressed therein, but also by the manner that they question the viewer. In fact, the works take on a political dimension, while avoiding any pamphleteering facilitism. This occurs because their expression does not arise from any peremptory statement, but rather from an invitation that operates by means of seduction. A process of seduction that is based on a cultural connection, that is also haptic - where the perception of matter, between that which covers and structures, plays a key role in involving the spectator.

In this case, discussing the encounter as a place that has a complex identity - that which pushes us away is also that which brings us closer and that which hides is also that which reveals, or that which is strange is also that which seduces.
